ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

I

The name of this Corporation shall be Cuyamaca Rancho State Park Interpretive Association.

II

The purposes for which this Corporation is formed are:

(a) The specific and primary purposes are to promote the educational and interpretive activities of the State Park System, principally in Cuyamaca Rancho State Park, by producing and making available to park visitors, by sale or free distribution, suitable interpretive and educational literature, including books, maps, pamphlets, visuals and recordings; by buying, selling, and distributing state-printed and other publications, including illustrated materials and other merchandise symbolic of the events or significance of the area as the Director of the Department of Parks and Recreation may approve; by acquiring display materials or objects pertaining to the history or natural history of the area for the purpose of adding them to the interpretive collections of the State Park System; by developing and maintaining a suitable park library for Cuyamaca Rancho State Park; by assisting in the development and improvement of interpretive features, including signs, markers, and audio stations, when aid is requested by the State Park System; by supporting the collection of historical and scientific

specimens pertaining to the park and assist in their preservation; by assisting financially and otherwise in the establishment and operation of similar cooperating societies in other areas of the State Park System, and by giving all possible aid to the State Government in conserving, developing and interpreting the areas of the State Park System for the benefit of the public.

No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation.

(b) The general purposes and powers are to have and exercise all rights and powers conferred on non-profit corporations under the laws of California, including the power to contract, rent, buy or sell personal or real property; provided, however, that this Corporation shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the primary purposes of this corporation.

III

This Corporation is organized pursuant to the general nonprofit Corporation Law of the State of California.

IV

The county in this State where the principal office for the transaction of the business of the Corporation is located is San Diego County.

The authorized number and qualifications of members of the corporation, the different classes of membership, if any, the property, voting and other rights and privileges of members, and their liability to dues and assessments and the method of collection thereof, shall be as set forth in the by-laws.

VII

This Corporation is not organized, nor shall it be operated, for pecuniary gain or profit, and it does not contemplate the distribution of gains, profits or dividends to the members thereof and is organized solely for non-profit purposes. The property, assets, profits and net income of this Corporation are irrevocably dedicated to charitable and educational purposes and no part of the profits or net income of this Corporation shall ever inure to the benefit of any director, officer, or member thereof or to the benefit of any private shareholder or individual. Upon the dissolution or winding up of this Corporation, its assets remaining after payment of, or provision for payment of all debts and liabilities of this Corporation, shall be distributed to the State of California to be used for purposes of the State Park System. In the event that the State of California refuses to accept said distribution or any part thereof, said assets shall be distributed to the county or municipal corporation or district or other public agency within whose jurisdiction the assets are located to be used for charitable and educational park purposes within said jurisdiction, said agency to be determined by the Board of Directors. If this Corporation holds any assets in trust, said assets shall be disposed of for charitable and educational park purposes or Cy Pres by decree of the Superior Court of the county in which this Corporation's principal office is located, upon petition therefor by the Attorney General or by any person concerned in the liquidation.

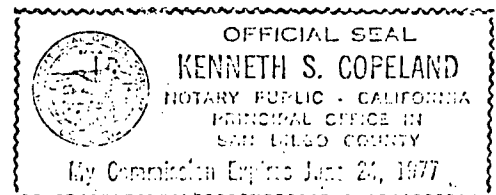

BY-LAWS

of the

CUYAMACA RANCHO STATE PARK INTERPRETIVE ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE I
(Purpose)

Section I. The operations, and use of property, and assets of the Cuyamaca Rancho State Park Interpretive Association shall be limited to interpretive and other educational purposes.

ARTICLE II
(Administration)

Section I. The Association shall have a Board of Directors, an Executive Secretary and a Treasurer. These officers shall serve without compensation except that the Treasurer may be a salaried officer if and when so established by the Board of Directors. The Executive Secretary shall be appointed by the Area Manager and must be a Ranger II or higher at Cuyamaca Rancho State Park.

Section II. The Board of Directors shall be composed of 11 members. It will formulate the policy of the Association and will direct its activities through the Executive Secretary. The members of the Board shall choose a chairperson and a vice-chairperson from among their members at the first meeting of each calendar year.

Section III. Vacancies on the Board of Directors shall be filled by election or majority approval of the remaining board members, with the concurrence of the Executive Secretary, for the remainder of the unexpired term. The

be held on the same day as the annual meeting of the membership of the Association, and at the discretion of the Board by unanimous consent, may be held concurrently with the annual membership meetings. Additional Board meetings may be called at any time by the Chairperson. In the event the Chairperson is unable to serve, the Vice-Chairperson shall preside in his absence. A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Section V. The Executive Secretary shall carry out the business of the Association in accordance with the policies established by the Board. It shall be his duty to supervise the activities of the Association and to submit an annual report of its activities to the Board of Directors. He may authorize the expenditure and co-sign checks of the Association for funds to be used for printing, stationery, secretarial or other employment, and for incidental expenses necessary to advance the purposes of the Association.

Section VI. The Treasurer is responsible for administering the finances of the Association. This position is not to be filled by a State Park System employee. The Treasurer will receive monies from donations, membership dues, sales from publications, and other approved items that may be handled by the Association. The Treasurer will disburse these funds under the direction of the Executive Secretary. The Treasurer will keep or supervise the keeping of the Association books and records. The Board of Directors may require the incumbent in this position to be bonded, which cost will be furnished from Association funds.

The Treasurer will submit an annual financial report of receipts and expenditures to the Executive Secretary at the end of the business year. The annual

statement will be checked for accuracy by an approved source for auditing and accounting, after which it will be submitted to the Board of Directors on or before February 1, and transmitted to the Department of Parks and Recreation by the Executive Secretary.

Section VII. Elected officers and committee chairpersons may be removed from office for any of the following reasons:

- (1) Use of office for personal gain
- (2) Misappropriation of funds
- (3) Any act or statement which publicly embarrasses or jeopardizes the Association, the Department of Parks and Recreation, Cuyamaca Rancho State Park, or any employee thereof.

Any officer and/or committee chairperson so charged shall be notified in writing and a date shall be set for a meeting with the Board of Directors to investigate charges. If complaint is upheld by 2/3 of the Board members (11 members), such officer shall be removed from his position and may be required to forfeit his membership.

ARTICLE III (Amending of By-Laws)

The By-Laws may be amended by majority vote of the Board of Directors and ratified by a majority of the voting membership attending a regular annual meeting, or a special meeting called by the Chairperson, after written notification of the voting membership.

ARTICLE IV
(Committees)

There shall be two types of committees in the Association - standing committees and temporary committees.

Section I. Standing Committees. Standing committees shall be: Publication; Membership; Printing; Training; By-Laws. Each committee shall consist of a Chairperson elected by the majority of the Board for a term of one year, and at least one other person from the general membership, but not more than six persons total.

Section II. Temporary Committees. Other committees may be formed as deemed necessary by the Board, for whatever purpose, and shall exist until the goal or goals established for that committee have been accomplished. These committees shall consist of a Chairperson from the general membership, but not more than six persons total.

ARTICLE V
(Membership)

Section I. Membership is open, regardless of race, creed, color, age or sex, upon written application to the Executive Secretary, to any person interested in furthering the aims of the Association. Membership fees of five dollars (\$5.00) for a single voting membership and ten dollars (\$10.00) for a family membership with two votes will be required of all new members. Annual dues will be four dollars (\$4.00) for single membership and eight dollars (\$8.00) for family membership.

Section II. Honorary membership in the organization shall be granted by the Board of Directors for exemplary service to Cuyamaca Rancho State Park. By the ratification of these By-Laws be it known that the first honorary member shall be Harvey W. Moore.

Section III. An annual open meeting, for members, shall be held on a date established by mutual consent of the Board of Directors

ARTICLE VI
(Fiscal Policy)

Section I. The Executive Secretary shall not authorize an expenditure of more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00), without the prior approval of the Board of Directors, unless such expenditure is in payment of obligations incurred as a result of action previously approved by the Board.

Section II. All new ventures in the activities of the Association, such as a major publication, handling of a possibly controversial sales item, the purchase of costly objects for museums, the development of interpretive facilities in any State Park System area, or the purchase of land, shall be approved by the Board of Directors, and expenditures specifically authorized for such purposes by the Board before the Executive Secretary or the Treasurer may make disbursements in these matters.

Section III. The Treasurer shall make no disbursements of the Association's funds, other than routine commercial resale purchases and payrolls, without authorization from the Executive Secretary. The Treasurer shall deposit all funds of the Association in a bank approved by the Board of Directors, at frequent intervals, and in the name of the Association.

Section IV. Whenever the cash balances of the Association are deemed to be in excess of actual needs for the immediate future, the Board of Directors may authorize the investment of any surpluses for interest earning purposes in United States Government Bonds and/or in savings accounts in banks or

savings and loan associations where deposits are guaranteed by the Federal Government. Such deposits shall be made in the name of the Association with authority for the making of deposits and withdrawals vested in the Treasurer of the Association. The Board of Directors is further empowered to authorize loans or donations to other cooperating associations for the purpose of furthering their educational and interpretive work, when deemed advisable.

Section V. There shall be no cash disbursements except those made by the Executive Secretary from imprest and petty cash funds which are authorized for this use. These petty cash funds shall be established not to exceed twenty-five dollars (\$25.00). Reimbursement to the petty cash fund shall be made by check at any time by request of the Executive Secretary. Such reimbursement must be supported by valid receipts to cover all expenditures made from the fund.

Section VI. All checks drawn by the corporation shall be signed by both the Executive Secretary and the Treasurer.

Section VII. The State Park System shall be duly authorized to audit the records and review the internal controls of the business operations and to evaluate the benefits occurring to the State Park System from its cooperation with the Association.

ARTICLE VII
(Relations with Department of Parks and Recreation)

Section I. The Association's operations in Cuyamaca Rancho State Park are dependent upon formal designation as a cooperating Association by the Director of the California Department of Parks and Recreation.
